Gender stereotypes are messages that encourage us to think of certain looks, actions, or things as especially “manly” or “girly.” Gender stereotypes are often based on more extreme ideas about how boys and girls are supposed to act. Some people might not identify with these ideas, and can feel limited if others assume them to be true. Yet, people’s (sometimes subconscious) beliefs profoundly affect everyone’s lives. If these conversations are led right, ESL classes can provide safe spaces for our students to dive deeper into such broad, sensitive, and yet so crucial aspects as race, religion, social status, and appearance. shows/music videos) should improve as students exchange their ideas, broaden their understanding of gender roles and stereotypes, and gain insight as the difficulty of identifying the perpetuation of gender roles in media decreases over time. Lesson 1 - Gender Roles in the Media In this lesson, elementary students practice critical literacy skills around themes of gender identity and stereotypes. Children look at one or more picture books that counter gender stereotypes, and after a discussion of the book, engage in a creative writing activity geared at fostering individual identity and resisting social definitions of what and how a boy or girl “should” be. Four Ways to Teach Gender Equity in ... - Participate Learning This lesson is designed to affect attitudes and receptiveness to new ideas, which are learning outcomes unlikely to be measurable by traditional assessment methods. Teachers should look for students' willingness to participate, openness to new ideas, and their level of empathy toward targets of bias and discrimination.

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
